
What's going on around the barn?

We are pleased to have been awarded funds for the yearly inoculations for all of our horses from the **American Association of Equine Practitioners**, due to the recommendation of Dr. Ball at the Bracken Equine Clinic.

We also received a grant from the **Amy Shelton McNutt Trust** to cover the annual expense of all of the horses going to the Retama Equine Hospital for their annual teeth floating, Coggins testing, and check-ups.

We greatly appreciate the generosity of both **Dr. Martin** and **Dr. Huffman** in ensuring the health of our horses, as well as providing us a 25% discount on the services.

In April 2019 the walls in the covered riding arena were demolished and replaced with cinder block walls. We also had (2) BIG ASS FANS[®] installed in the covered riding arena during this time. We are grateful to **Valero**[•] for providing a grant to partially cover the cost of the fans, as well as materials and installation. Our horses, riders, therapists, instructors and volunteers are much more comfortable in the summer heat.



We had a big volunteer group on Saturday, May 4th from the **Travis Manion Foundation**. All saddles and bridles were cleaned. The alfalfa room was emptied of all items and swept out. All the items were cleaned and put back in their proper places. With the disapproval of the cats, they weeded both of the plant beds in the back of the barn.
