Now a Judson High School Senior, she was recently awarded her Varsity Letterman jacket for Special Olympics Bowling and Track and Field. Cameron is a Two-time State Champion and Special Olympics Gold Medalist in the Softball Toss and the Wheelchair Slalom events. In addition, for the last three years, Cameron has been a member of the Judson High School Satellite Pep Squad. She is the first Special Needs student to participate in the dance program in the school's 58 year history. Cameron's parents, Bruce and Cassandra, have been very involved in her school and extra-curricular activities. Bruce is a SLC Board Member. Cameron has a younger sister, Hayden, who is in

the 7th grade at nearby Kitty Hawk Middle School.


