

We are pleased to announce that the Saddle Light Center achieved re-certification of our Premier Accredited Center status by PATH Int'l. (Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship). PATH certifies centers and instructors to provide equine-assisted services to individuals with a diagnosed disability. In Texas there are a total of 68 PATH Centers, but only 23 have met the requirements to be a Premier Accredited Center (PAC). The others are Member Centers. There are only 3 PAC centers within 100 miles - Pipe Creek, Georgetown, Saddle Light in Selma and no others south of San Antonio. Others are located in and around Houston, Dallas and farther north.

Recent Grants Received:

- The **Amy Shelton McNutt Trust** awarded us a grant that paid for the horses' "annual migration" to the veterinarian for Coggins test, sheath cleaning for the boys, and teeth cleaning.
- The American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP) awarded us a grant to pay for the horses' inoculations
- The Saddle Light Center is listed in each section of the San Antonio Metro Public Sector Campaign, Bexar County Charitable Campaign, City of San Antonio Charitable Campaign, Combined School District Charitable Campaign and San Antonio Water Systems Charitable Campaign, for employees to be able to donate. 
